### **Report of Welbury WI March meeting**

After a short business meeting members and guest listened to a fascinating talk by Helen Neave from Make it Wild. We listened in awe to her remarkable careers, starting with being one of very few female trainee surgeons and becoming an ENT consultant. Helen especially loved operating in the ear and fixing patients, but she felt there was something lacking in her training and went on to do a Masters in education to improve the training of future surgeons which then led to holding national roles with healthcare regulators all whilst being mum to three children. Helen and her husband love nature and wanted to find ways to help to save the planet. The first step to doing this was when they bought 26 acres of rough grazing near York and wanted to give it back to nature. They did this by planting 18,000 trees and after 6 years a woodland was starting to establish and was buzzing with life. From this Make it Wild was born and they now have 7 sites, have planted 60,000 locally reared native trees, have Belted Galloways to graze some sites to improve biodiversity and even some Exmoor Ponies to naturally keep thistles and gorse under control. Helen went from helping individual patients as a surgeon to helping improve the lives of lots of patients in her educational phase to helping the planet with the aid of her spade in the third stage of her career.

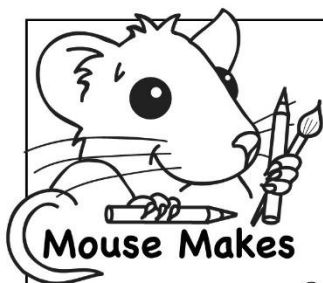
