

"The Loss of Depth and Growth of Superficiality"

Perhaps it was just me, but this Christmas seemed to be more superficial than ever, as far as it was portrayed on TV, radio and social media. The lack of depth and thought that had gone into what many people seemed to be saying, makes one ask, "where was the real reflection on what was going on rather than the tired, exhausted platitudes about the 'holiday season?" The Poet R.S. Thomas's ironic words about Christmas came to mind "What is Christmas without snow." Of course, it is exactly the same as with snow, but from a sentimental point of view, what you really need is the trimmings for Christmas, and foremost amongst these is snow.

So, all this superficiality seems to grow greater by the year whilst the real depths of what is happening at Christmas may be mentioned but don't seem to be reflected upon. Of course, it wasn't 100% like this – King Charles did indeed reflect very effectively on Jesus' birth, and you could always seek out people saying really interesting things online. But It seemed to me that a line had been crossed, into a bland superficiality, that lacked any real sense of depth, any reflection on the Christmas story.

A verse from the Psalms brings to mind the depths of God's love and our encounter with God, "Deep calls to deep in the roar of your waterfalls." Ps 42:7. It brings to mind the flood waters cascading down Mount Hermon, roaring into the deep pools beneath waterfalls. The depths of the pools communicating with the depths of the mountain. Here the unfathomable depths of God, can be thought of as communicating with the deeper spiritual side of our own being. It is this sort of depth that we see being eroded.

But finally – the most important thing about our religious life is love - and learning to become more loving people. It may be that many people who have forgotten about the deep things of God, were also amongst the most loving and welcoming to their friends and family. If this is so, then there is hope that the deeper things will be remembered once more.


