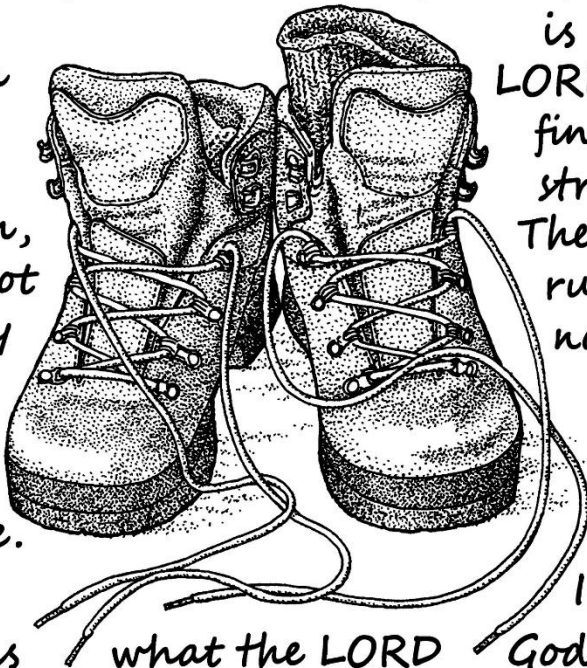

“Cost of Living Crisis”

Whatever the actual figures turn out to be, it seems almost certain that the cost of energy this winter is going to push many people into a very difficult situation. According to some estimates the number of people living in fuel poverty in Yorkshire could reach 58.5%. This means that they would be spending more than 10% of income on fuel.

For some the costs will be bearable, but for others who are already struggling this could mean serious problems, especially those who are having to pay more for mortgages and those who are also finding the rate of inflation for other items particularly difficult.

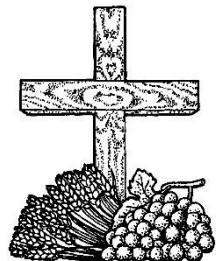
It's not possible for us to solve this problem, but there are small things that we can do which could make a difference to some people, especially if we will not be so seriously affected by the crisis. For instance, we can listen to those who might be struggling and make sure that people are not stigmatised in our church communities. We can look out for neighbours who we know might be having a hard time. It might also be possible to invite people we think may be living in a cold house to a church event or service where they might keep warm. In addition to this we might think about giving hot meals to anyone we know can't afford much gas for cooking – or to invite people into our homes for a coffee so that they can be warm, if only for a short time.

We can also give to Hambleton Foodshare and to charities helping out at this time.

Finally, we can keep our neighbours in our prayers, so that we have them regularly in mind.

Welbury WI report of the August meeting

Our August speaker was Fiona Andrews from Dementia Forward, a local charity started in Ripon, supporting people living with dementia and their families across North Yorkshire <https://www.dementiaforward.org.uk/>

Fiona described some of the different kinds of dementia and outlined how the different types

progress. She explained how important it is to get a diagnosis to make a person's 'dementia journey' the best it can be by being prepared and living the best life they can. Sometimes dementia like symptoms can have other treatable causes such as infection, thyroid disorder etc. so the message was if you are concerned that you or someone close has symptoms to seek advice from your GP sooner rather than later.

Loss of peripheral vision happens quite quickly with dementia which can lead to misperceptions and misidentification all increasing a sufferer's anxiety. Simple measures such as contrasting colours (e.g., toilet seats in bathrooms) help to make things easier for the person with dementia.

There was some good news in the form of evidence based recommendations to reduce the risk of dementia; education (cognitive stimulation), exercise (150 minutes per week of aerobic exercise), stop smoking, control blood pressure, cholesterol & blood sugars (if diabetic). 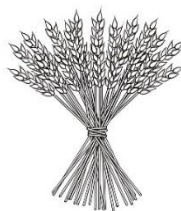

St Leonard's churchyard tidying day Sunday 2nd October anytime from 11am.

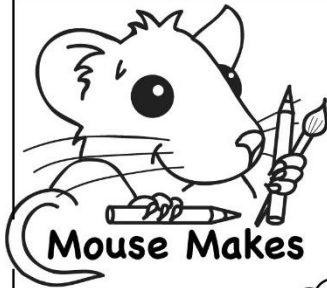

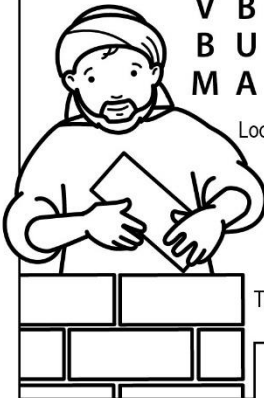
