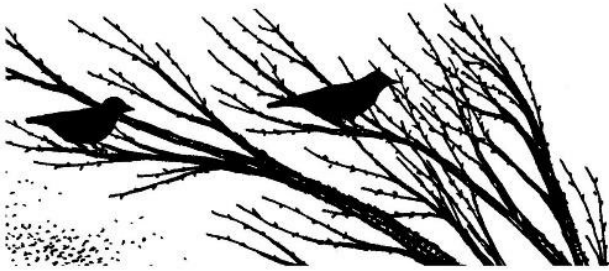

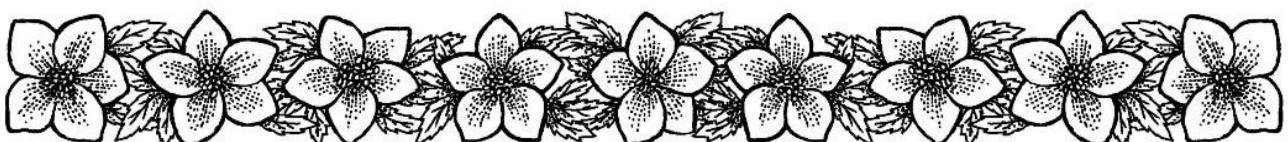

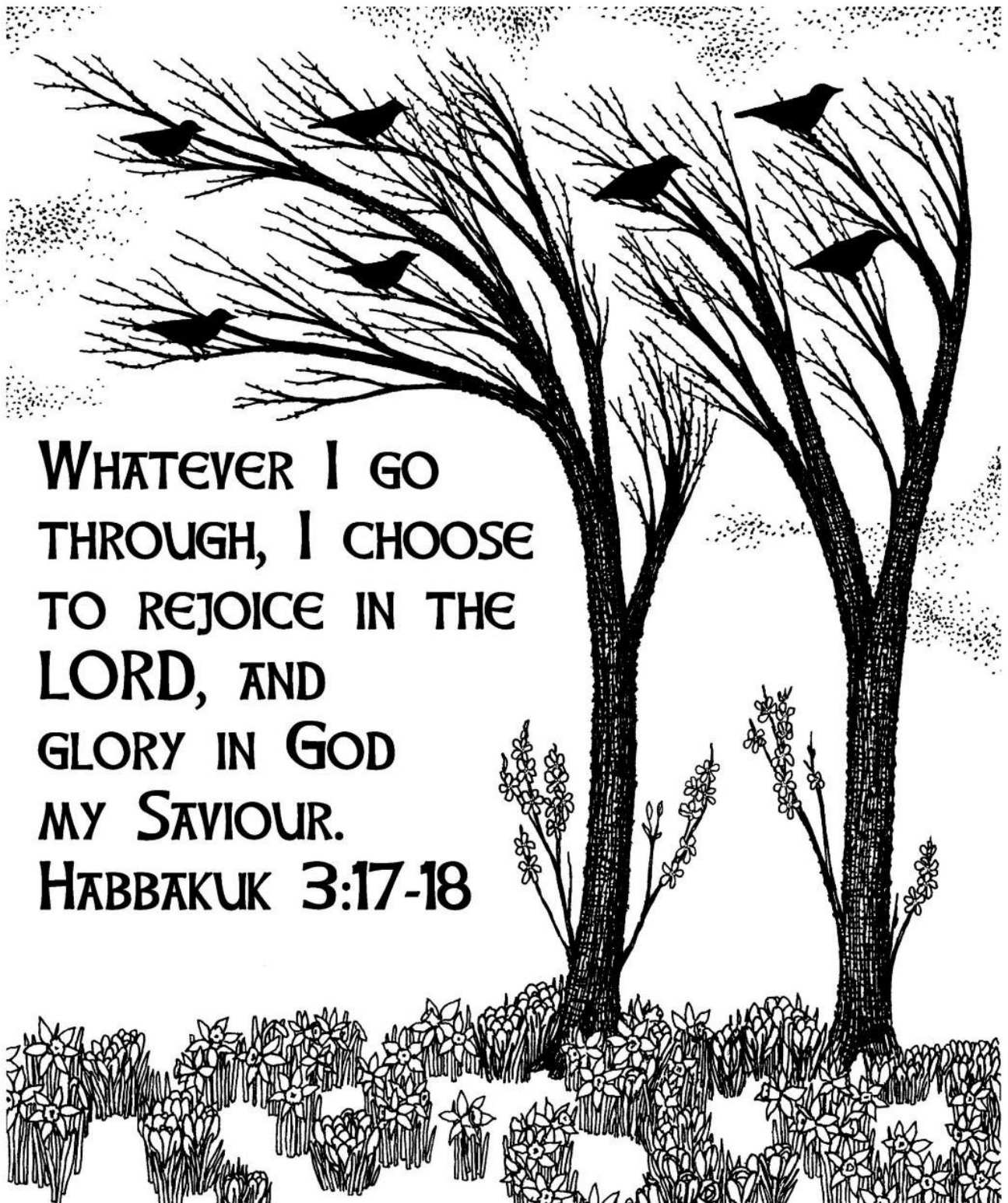

“Times and Seasons - Lent 2023”

Time was strangely stretched and distorted during the lockdowns and it's only now that events are getting back to pre-pandemic regularity that time seems to be getting back to normal. Of course, it's not just lockdowns which cause time to get distorted. Getting older means times somehow seems to speed up, when we get ill time can seem to slow down.

Not, surprisingly, we want to make the best use of time that we can. There are various systems which are supposed to help us manage our time, but unfortunately very often they end up like a straitjacket. We can end up spending more time administering the time management system, then we previously wasted earlier.

If you look online or in newspapers, you can often see anniversaries of various celebrity linked events for every day of the year. Of course, these things seem very superficial. They don't really help to mark important times during the year. For that we really need noteworthy events - events that help us to deepen our appreciation of time - to deepen our spirituality - not just to escape from reality for a while

Lent is one of these times when we can really appreciate a season of preparation for the central moments of our faith, which is the crucifixion of Christ on Good Friday and his resurrection on Easter day. So, it's a good idea at this time to think about what we might for Lent this year. If there is a book we might read, if there's something we might give up, if we could pray more or if we might come to the Lent course Brompton, which begins on March 1. Whatever we do, Lent gives us a way of marking the time of deepening our commitment and affirming our faith in a way which only a season like this could achieve.

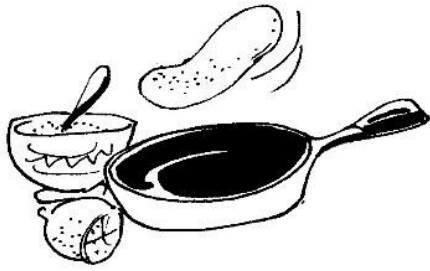

All very welcome. Please stay for refreshments after the service.

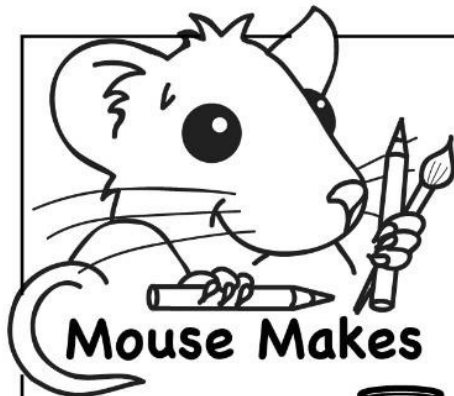
Welbury Lent Appeal
