“Willibrord of York”

On November 7th we celebrate the life of a local saint, Willibrord of York. He was born near York and educated at Ripon. He may have spent some time in exile due to the deposing of the Abbot, Wilfred of York. After being ordained in 688 A.D. he was sent as a missionary to Europe, specifically to the Frisian people, who lived in what is now the Netherlands, Germany and Luxembourg. He established a monastery and Cathedral at Utrecht and became the first Bishop of that city. He also undertook a number of journeys to Rome, increasing his influence in the church in Europe.

After this he established a second monastery in Echternach, which is now in Luxembourg. He also endured a turbulent time here, having to flee from an invading King, but was eventually able to return. As part of his abbey in Echternach he established a scriptorium where they produced many of the bibles, psalms and prayer-books that are to be found today in the great libraries of Europe. His is believed to be the oldest dateable signature in the English language, it was made in a book now in Carlow in Ireland. He died in and was buried at Echternach and is the patron saint of Luxembourg.

As we think about mission in today's church it is important that we have great local figures from the past that we can take inspiration from.
