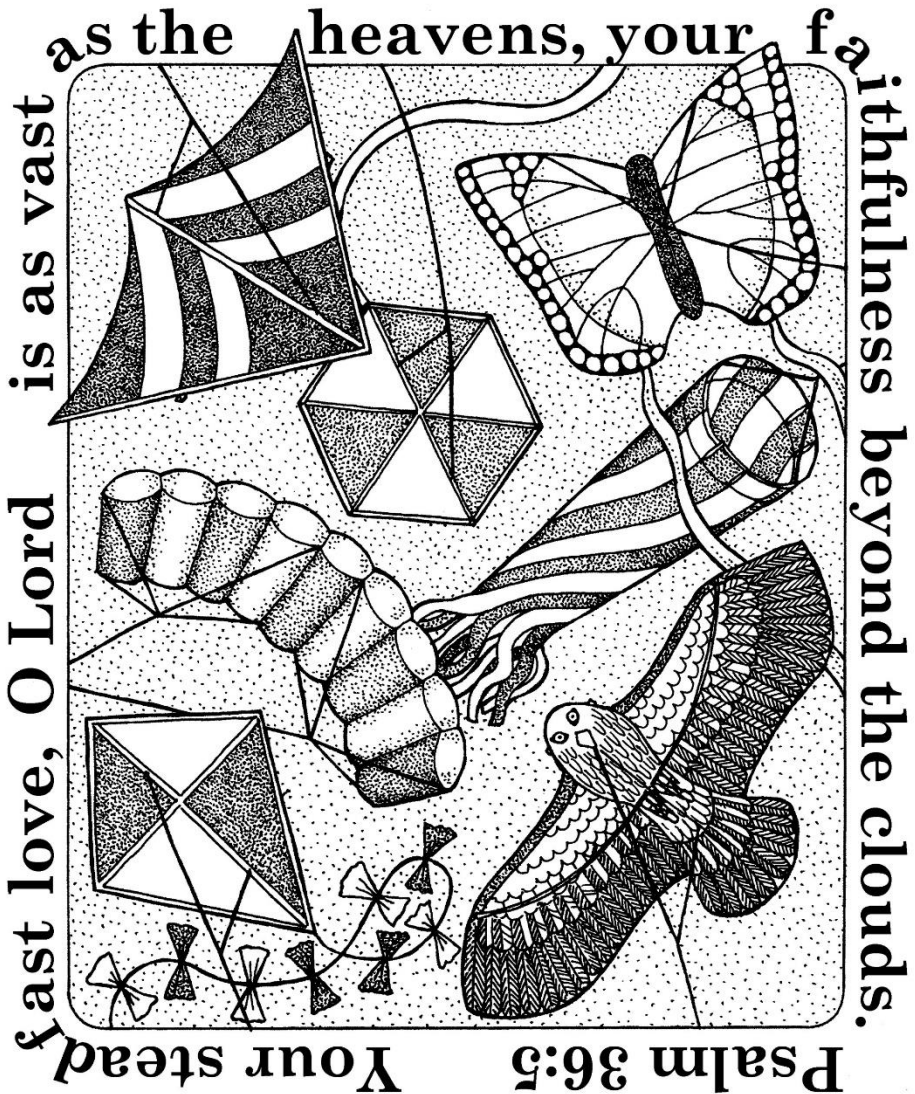

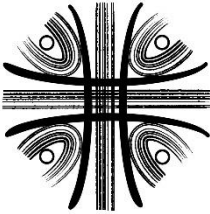

St Oswald, August 5th, Patron Saint of West Rounton



St. Oswald, a revered 7th-century king and martyr, stands as a beacon of faith and leadership in Christian history. Born around 604 AD, Oswald became King of Northumbria in 634 AD. His reign was marked by his dedication to spreading Christianity throughout his kingdom. After his victory at the Battle of Heavenfield, Oswald invited St. Aidan from Iona to establish a monastery on Lindisfarne, which became a pivotal centre for Christian evangelism and learning.

Oswald's commitment to his faith extended beyond mere patronage. Known for his piety and charity, he famously shared his feast with the poor, embodying Christ's teachings. His untimely death in 642 AD at the Battle of Maserfield did not diminish his influence. Instead, he was venerated as a martyr, and his legacy as a devout Christian king continued to inspire. St. Oswald's life exemplifies the virtues of faith, charity, and leadership, making him a cherished figure in Christian history.

Our July speakers were Jill with her guide dog Poppy and Caroline with her husband's guide dog Storm. Caroline gave the history of Guide Dogs for the Blind from its inception in 1931 to present day. She explained how more recently Guide Dogs are also helping children in many different ways because childhood sight loss is on the increase. She then invited us to try and guess what kind of dogs Poppy & Storm are. Poppy was easy as a black Labrador, but Storm was more challenging and none of us guessed Retriever/German Shepherd with his silky black coat. Jill then went on to tell us about her sight loss, how she got Poppy, and the difference Poppy has made to her life. Jill's husband, Neil, came along to help and reiterated how much more confident Jill has become since Poppy arrived. A pooled supper was then enjoyed by all.

St Leonard's Church often has visitors looking for members of their family tree, none more

memorable than the time a headstone was discovered during the annual churchyard tidying day only to be the headstone visitors were looking for that arrived very soon after it was uncovered! The headstone was Ann Mawer from 1746!

It has taken many hours collating the information from Northallerton County Record Office, Cleveland, North Yorkshire & South Durham Family History Society, and the church registers to bring it all together in one file. The file contains a list of monumental inscriptions (many of which are no longer decipherable), an index of surnames and a plan of the churchyard showing where the headstone with that particular surname is located. It also contains the burial records from 1698 to the present day. Some graves are unmarked and, for those that are known, another plan and list showing these is also included

The green file is readily accessible in the church porch even when church is closed.

Donations of raffle prizes would be appreciated prior to the event & on the day.

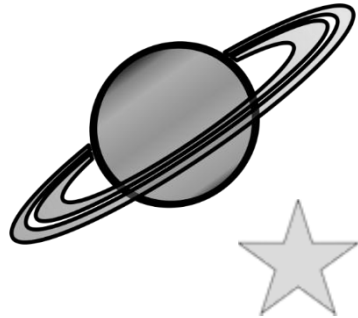

We'll sail over to the east side of the lake



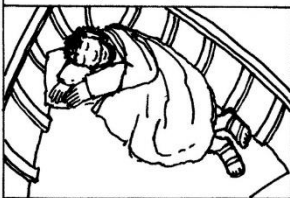
Suddenly a massive storm blew up

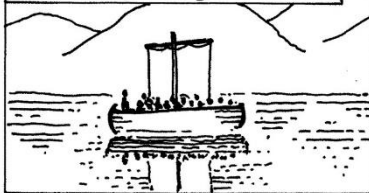

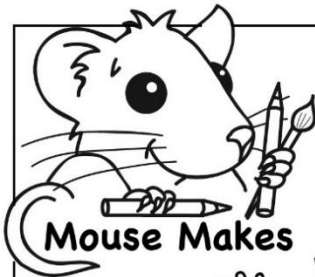
