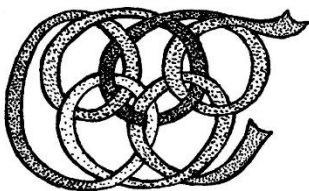

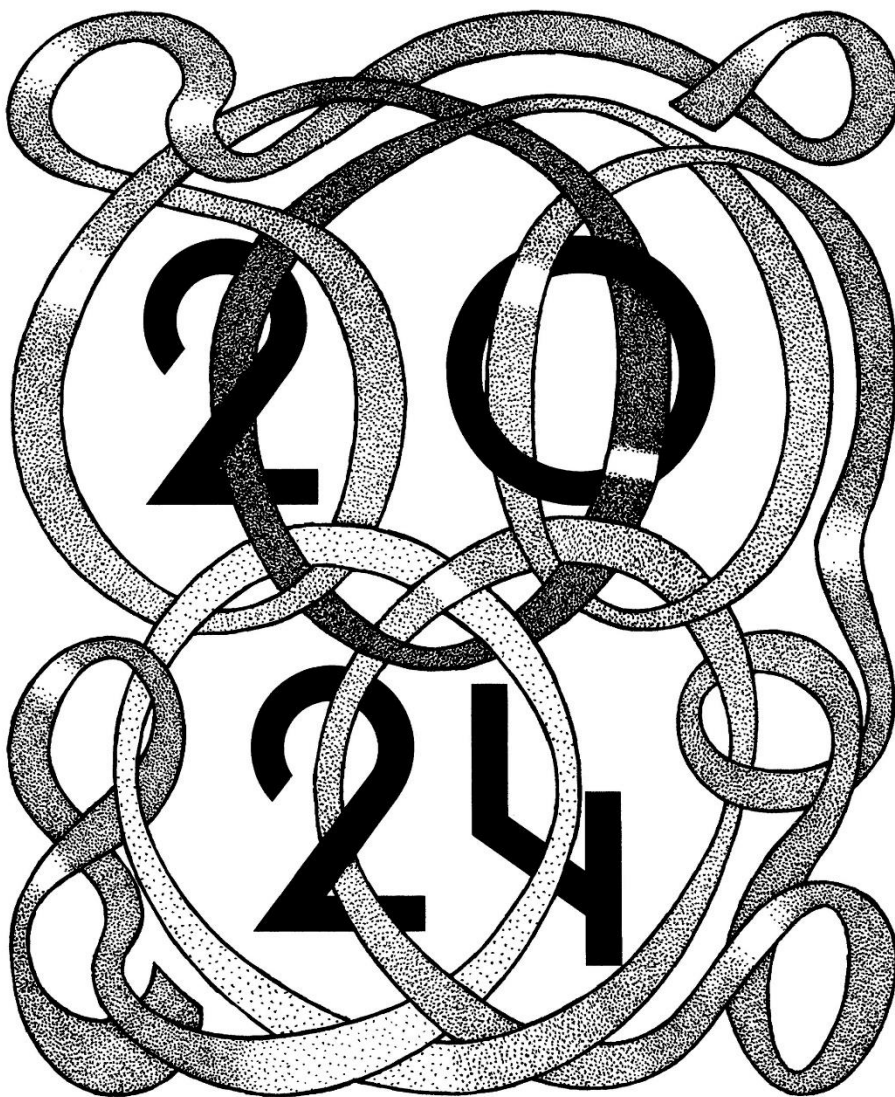

Elizabeth Ferard - A Pioneer of Women's Ministry - Feast Day, July 18th

Elizabeth Ferard (1825–1883) holds a significant place in Anglican Church history as the first deaconess of the Church of England. Her pioneering work laid the foundation for women's ministry within the Anglican tradition. Born into a devout family in London, Elizabeth felt a strong calling to serve the church and its community.

In 1861, inspired by the deaconess movement in Europe, she founded the North London Deaconess Institution. This institution aimed to train women in both theological education and practical nursing, empowering them to serve in parishes, hospitals, and among the poor. Elizabeth's commitment to this cause was recognized by Bishop Tait of London, who appointed her as the first deaconess in the Church of England in 1862.

Elizabeth's work as a deaconess involved visiting the sick, teaching, and providing pastoral care, embodying Christ's call to serve others. Her efforts helped to formalise and expand the role of women in the church's ministry, leading to the establishment of the deaconess order, which eventually evolved into modern ordained ministry for women.

Elizabeth Ferard's legacy is a testament to her faith, dedication, and pioneering spirit. Her contributions continue to inspire and shape the role of women in the church today, demonstrating the vital importance of compassionate service and leadership.

Over 4000 women singing Jerusalem was an amazing experience followed by inspirational & thought provoking speakers focusing on anti-violence against women. 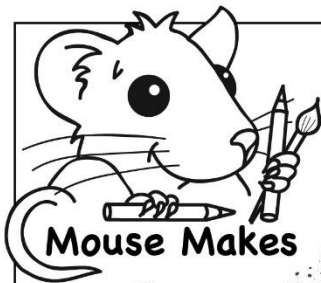
