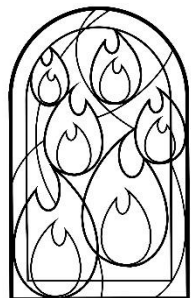

Come and relax with a glass of prosecco and chocolate (or tea/coffee). Donations will be gratefully received.

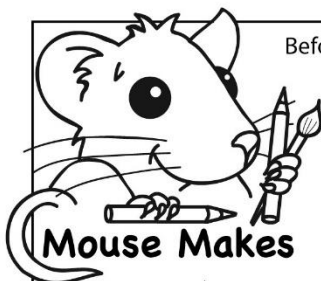

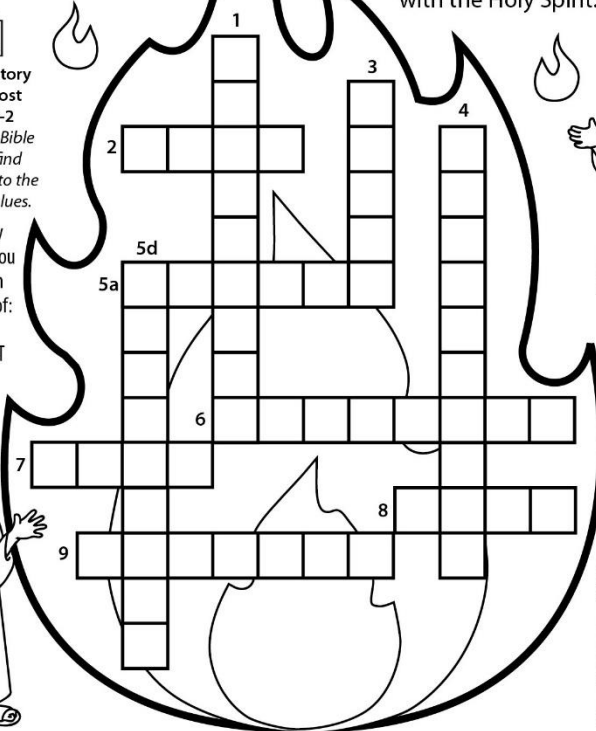

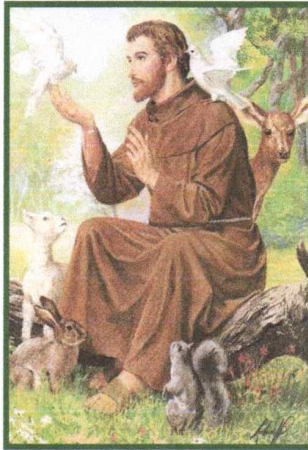
