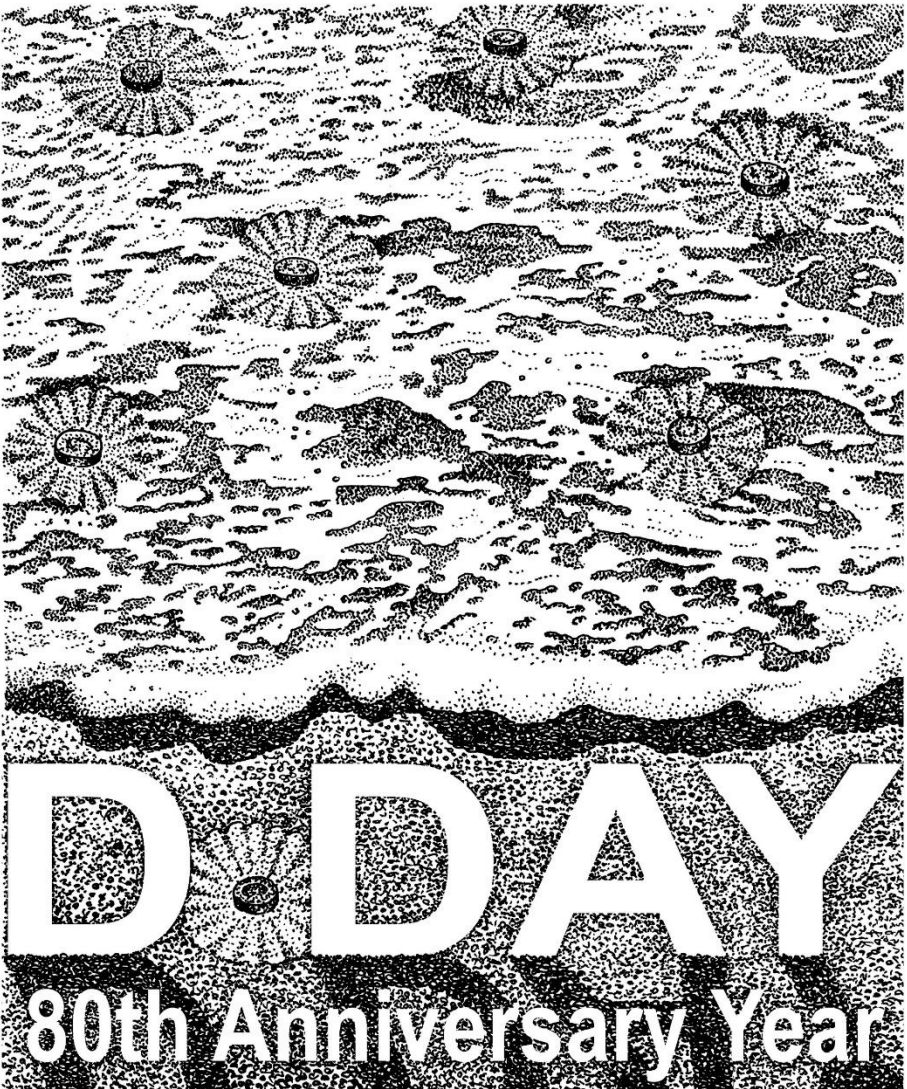

Notice from Rounton Parish Council

At the last Parish Council Meeting it was asked whether the Parish Council could do more for the parish.

At Present the annual Precept is £1000 and has remained unchanged for the last 5 years.

The Parish council Pays for a salt bin and grass cutting of the green and foot path past the kennels. It also pays for the maintenance of the Defibulators at East and West Rounton. The precept just covers this with a small amount coming from the reserves.

The reserve arises from a donation of £5000 given by National Grid to the community as a result of the pylons running through the parish. This was put aside in case the trees on the West Rounton village green needed cutting down. One was removed for £575 however the others could be more if they need felling.

The suggestion is that the PC could fund small scale events or facilities if there was enough support from the Parish to increase the precept.

However, due to the construction of a new dwelling in the Parish we have received a one off payment of £1080.75 as part of the Community Infrastructure Levey on new build.

One suggestion was a Christmas Tree and lights on the West Rounton Green and in front of East Rounton Village Hall.

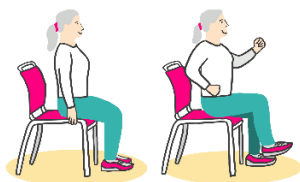

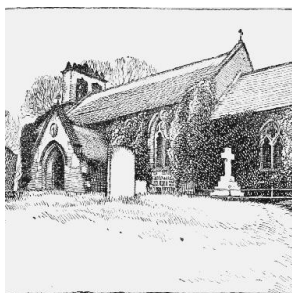

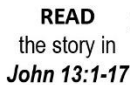
The 16th of October 2024 was UK Restart a Heart Day.



More than 30,000 out-of-hospital cardiac arrests happen every year in the UK, with sadly less than 1 in 10 surviving.

Welbury Parish Council is hosting an introduction to defibrillator use (1 sited outside the pub) and CPR skills in Welbury Village Hall on Wednesday 13th November at 7.30pm. *Early CPR and defibrillation can more than double the chances of survival, which is why it's so crucial to learn.*

Please just turn up on the night and give up 30 minutes of your time, you never know it could save someone's life.

COMMUNITY PROJECT SAVE THE HORSESHOE INN WEST ROUNTON

We are Rountons Community Hub Ltd a not-for-profit Community Benefit Society. We are dedicated to purchasing and reopening the Horseshoe Inn as a Community Pub. Our overall goal is to run the pub as a good quality food and drink establishment as well as a community hub, providing a café and other facilities during the

day to meet community needs.

Our Community Campaign project started in January 2024, and we so far have received amazing support. We have received 70 pledges to buy shares in the pub totalling £62,000 to date and have received support from 16 local businesses and farms. Before the election we had made a funding application to the government for the remaining money needed to buy the pub. However, due to the change in government our application was put on hold, and we are now waiting to hear if the fund is still available. Our MP, Rishi Sunak, is lobbying on our behalf. In the meantime, we are applying to other funding organisations/platforms and seeking further pledges and donations to raise the remainder of the required money.
