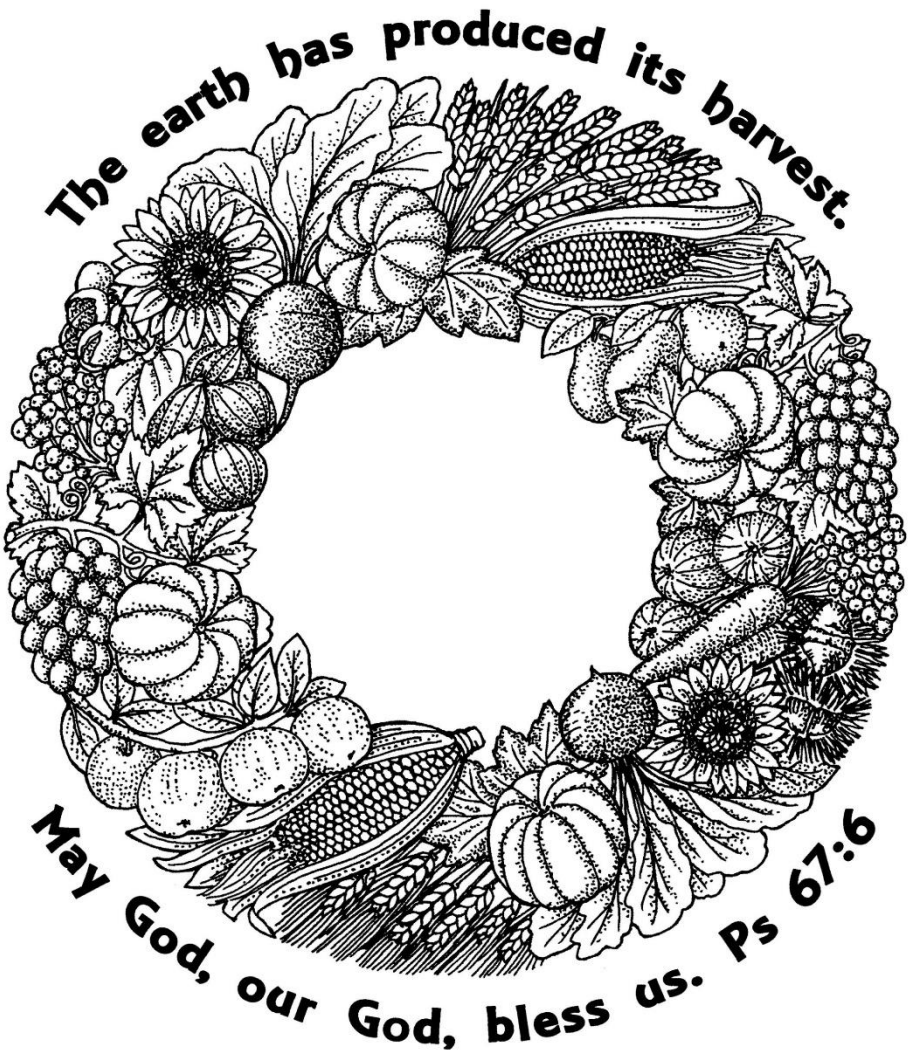

Martin Luther – Feast Day 31st October

Martin Luther, a German monk and theologian, was a central figure in the Protestant Reformation of the 16th century. Born in 1483, Luther became known for challenging the practices of the Catholic Church, particularly the sale of indulgences, which were seen as a way to buy forgiveness for sins. In 1517, he famously nailed his 95 *Theses* to the door of the Wittenberg Church, sparking debate across Europe. Luther's writings emphasized the idea that salvation comes through faith alone, not by works or church sacraments, which was revolutionary at the time. His translation of the Bible into German made the scriptures more accessible to ordinary people, reshaping religious life. Despite facing intense opposition, Luther's work inspired a movement that forever changed Christianity, leading to the establishment of Protestantism and altering the course of Western history. His legacy endures in churches around the world today.

The words at the end of his speech at the wonderfully titled *Diet of Worms* (Worms being a city in Germany,) still remain famous today, as he said;

I neither can nor will retract anything; for it cannot be either safe or honest for a Christian to speak against his conscience. Here I stand. I can do no other, so help me God. Amen.

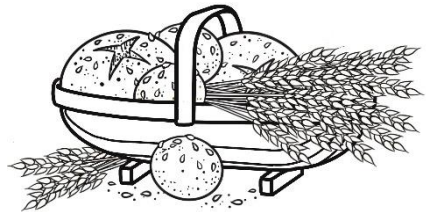

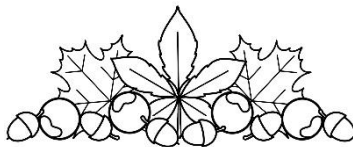
Family Harvest Festival Service at St Leonard's Welbury Sunday 13th October 2024 at 11am

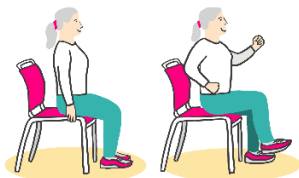

Looking after St Leonard's

To keep St Leonard's looking as lovely as it does, both outside and inside (so it's always ready for Christenings, weddings & funerals) requires lots of time and effort by a few volunteers. Every autumn, weather permitting, a special effort is made to get on top of all the jobs, but to do this, volunteers are needed (please see below for dates and full details)

St Leonard's churchyard tidying day Saturday 12th October anytime from 10.30am. Many hands make light work so if anyone can spare a few hours that would be much appreciated. If the weather is wet this will become the indoor day with hope for better weather on the 14th of October. Jobs that need doing are listed below but could be done prior to this date if anyone has chance: Hedge cutting, Weeding & sweeping the path - Strimming under the hedges and the areas of long grass - Cutting back any self-set trees especially ash & elder - Removing ivy where possible or cut it back - Tidying around all the graves (the lawnmowers get fairly close, but some spaces are inaccessible)

COMMUNITY PROJECT SAVE THE HORSESHOE INN WEST ROUNTON

We are Rountons Community Hub Ltd a not-for-profit Community Benefit Society. We are dedicated to purchasing and reopening the Horseshoe Inn as a Community Pub. Our overall goal is to run the pub as a good quality food and drink establishment as well as a community hub, providing a café and other facilities during the

day to meet community needs.

Our Community Campaign project started in January 2024, and we so far have received amazing support. We have received 70 pledges to buy shares in the pub totalling £62,000 to date and have received support from 16 local businesses and farms. Before the election we had made a funding application to the government for the remaining money needed to buy the pub. However, due to the change in government our application was put on hold, and we are now waiting to hear if the fund is still available. Our MP, Rishi Sunak, is lobbying on our behalf. In the meantime, we are applying to other funding organisations/platforms and seeking further pledges and donations to raise the remainder of the required money.

Would you be willing to make a pledge or provide a donation? A donation is purely a gift of money and does not involve buying a share in the pub.

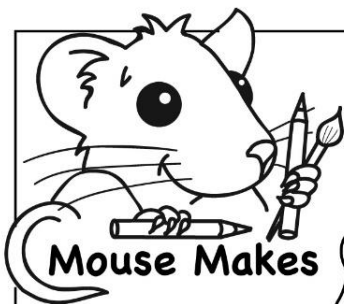
