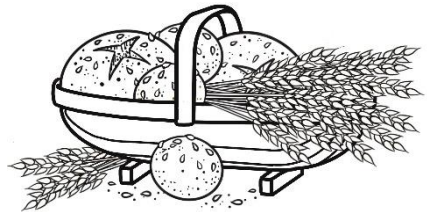
Indoor Bowls

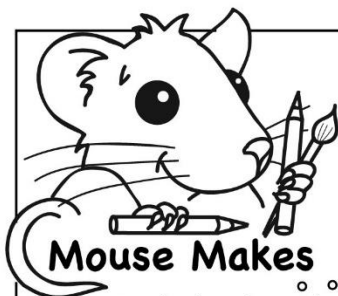
