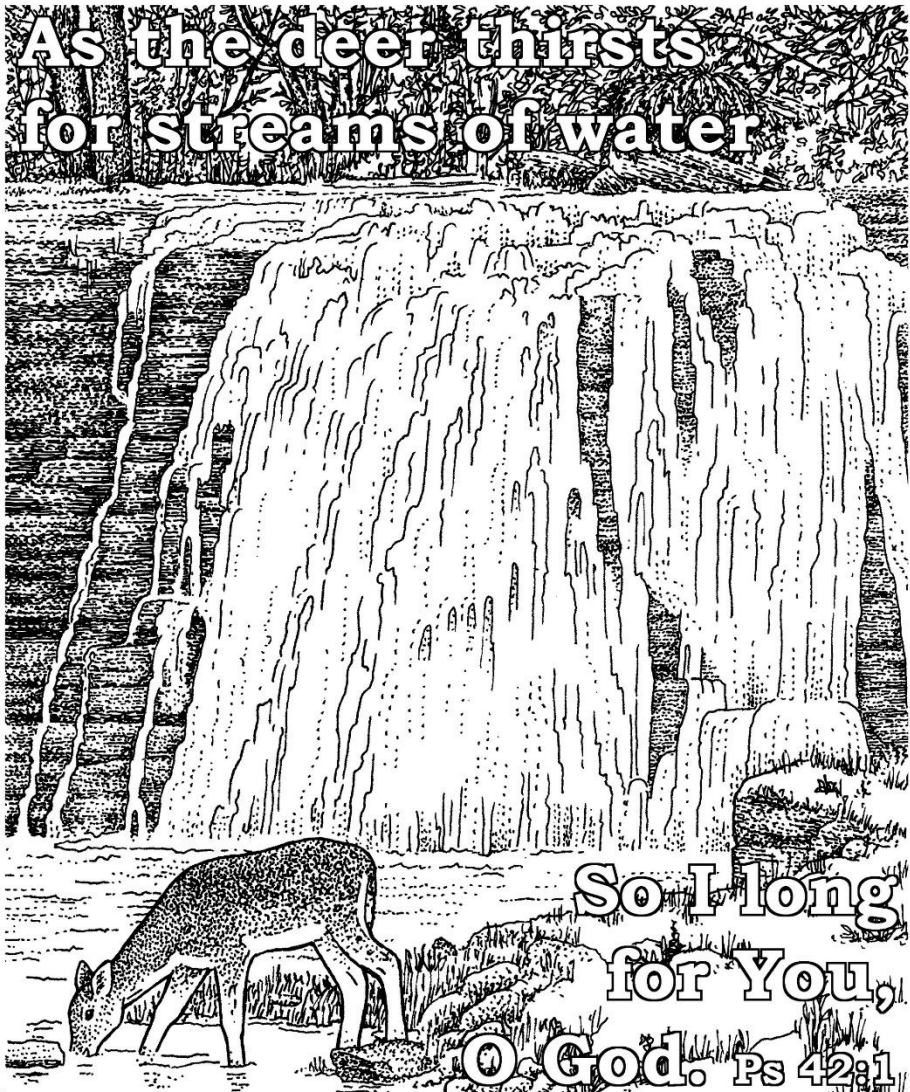

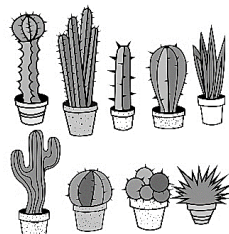

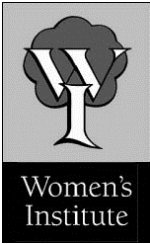

Report of Welbury WI June meeting

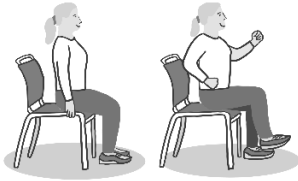
It was a lovely warm evening for our June meeting which was just perfect for tasting ice cream! Our speakers were the lovely Helen & Simon from Moonshine Ice Cream. Making their own ice cream came about when their youngest son was born and they needed food to be additive free because of his terrible eczema. Keith Floyd's Honey & Whisky ice cream recipe was the first they made. Later on, they had a pub where they experimented with lots of different recipes using fruit from their garden. Different fruits need different amounts of alcohol so lots of R&D was needed! However, not everyone wanted alcohol in, so they discovered a Mary Berry recipe that uses egg white instead. After leaving the pub they continued to get requests for their ice cream so after several years of giving it away they decided to start selling it and created Moonshine Ice Cream. The with (alcohol) range uses local honey for sweetness and the without range uses sugar. There's usually only 4-5 ingredients in each flavour; cream (from Acorn Dairies), fruit from the garden, honey or sugar, alcohol or egg white which probably explains how it tastes so fresh and delicious. We sampled several different flavours before Judy gave the vote of thanks and many of us purchased a flavour or two to take home. Helen, Simon and our guest joined 16 members for a delicious, pooled supper. Helen and Simon enjoyed reading the 'Moonshine Rhymes' created for this month's competition and said they had particularly enjoyed our rendition of Jerusalem at the beginning of the meeting.

Sat 9th August Rountons Village Hall from 6.30pm - Licensed Bar and Pizza night (Perseid meteor watching after dark - weather permitting)

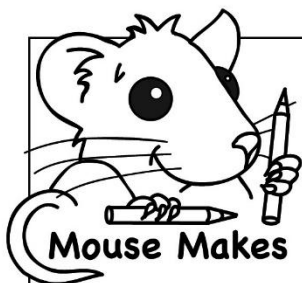
