Happy Yorkshire Day! Although I have lived in Yorkshire for 33 years, I only learnt about Yorkshire Day a few years ago. I thought I would look to see what it's all about.

When? Celebrated each year on 1st August, a date chosen as it is the anniversary of the emancipation of slaves in the British Empire in 1834 championed by William Wilberforce (a Yorkshireman)

Where? In all parts of Yorkshire – North, East, West and South and York too

Who? Anyone who was born or lives in Yorkshire or runs a business in Yorkshire

Why? Originally introduced in 1975 as a protest at moving local boundaries to help maintain Yorkshire's identity

How? Eating Yorkshire food or attending one of the many events

Aim? To celebrate Yorkshireness defined as "The common and unique traits of people from Yorkshire, such as being proud, tolerant, loyal, straight-talking, honest, hard-working, friendly and often comical"

This all leads me to wonder if Jesus could have been an honorary Yorkshireman? He was proud of his origins – beginnings of time and the whole of creation. He was very tolerant towards all even those who would disagree and those who would harm him. He was loyal to his disciples and to the will of God. He was straight talking and honest. He certainly worked hard at healing people and praying and spreading God's love, He was friendly to all no matter their background or circumstances and I wonder if at times his humanity would allow him to share joy in laughter with his friends. 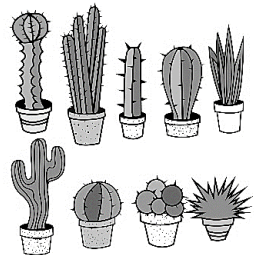

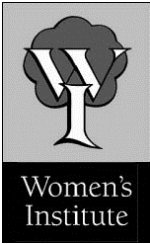
Teesside Cactus Society Annual Sale

Report of Welbury WI July meeting

After welcoming 5 guests and a rousing rendition of Jerusalem we welcomed back Kevin Thornhill to speak about his life with celebrities and fashion. Whilst studying at Manchester Kevin won a competition to design a costume for Virginia McKenna in The King & I. Kevin showed us a clip from the show of her dancing in the dress made from 35 yards of duchess satin with crystals and why they also need to design period undergarments as the huge, hooped skirts flew up to reveal her bloomers as she danced with Yul Brynner. He served his two years in a fashion house with The Emmanuel's who designed Lady Di's wedding dress (Kevin brought a replica of this dress with him) and he dressed Lady Di on her wedding day. From there he went to work on My Fair Lady with Dame Anna Neagle and then left shows to spend many years working for Elaine Paige. When she played Eva Perron in Evita Kevin became known to Andrew Lloyd Webber. He was asked to make several costumes for Sarah Brightman in Phantom of the Opera. Kevin described how the budget for costumes at the beginning of a show could be huge with Sarah Brightman's silk chiffon dressing gown costing £1500 compared with a show that had been running a long time needing a Spanish style wedding dress within 24 hours and a budget of £30! He achieved it with 2 king size sheets on sale at John Lewis. Kevin said usually it's a shame that only the first few rows get to see the costumes at their best but in this case, it was much better viewed from a distance. Sunset Boulevard had the most amazing costumes with the most amazing budget. He enjoyed working with Maureen Lipman in Oklahoma and had an amusing tale about her mother. The final show he worked on was Kiss me Kate with Kate O'Mara who he described as one of the loveliest women he had ever met. He then got married and opened a wedding dress shop in Peterlee and ran this for many years before retiring. He has raised thousands of pounds for charity by giving talks and staging wedding dress exhibitions. The exhibition, A Century of Wedding Gowns, will be coming to Middlesbrough in the New Year. We were then invited to try on a beautiful gown made from green shot organza. It was never used as it wasn't quick enough to get in and out of, the laces were replaced with hooks and eyes in the next design. Kevin joined us for a delicious, pooled supper and celebratory birthday cake.

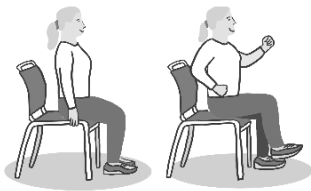

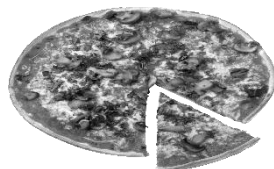

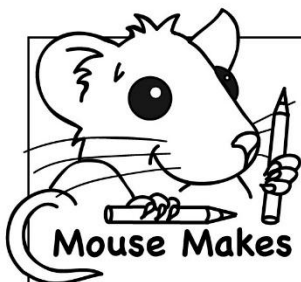
