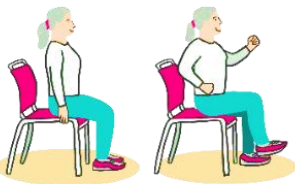
St Leonard's Church Open

Report from Welbury WI's May meeting

Our speaker, Katherine Brown from Roots farm shop led our group for a walk around the copse of trees opposite Roots, encouraging us to walk slowly and take note of our surroundings, to feel the ground under your feet, listen to sounds around you, the smells of the plants, as well as what you can see. Katherine showed us some of the plants, sharing interesting facts about them, for example, if they had medicinal qualities. We were warned of the importance of correctly identifying plants, at certain stages of its lifecycle hemlock looks very similar to cow parsley, whereas cow parsley is harmless, hemlock is a poisonous plant.



We were also shown where Rounton Grange once stood, before death duties depleted the family wealth. Only the estate cottages, a few outbuildings and the old water tower remain standing. The family tried to give the estate to the National Trust, who were unable to take it as the family could not provide the necessary endowment. Philip Webb designed the hall and

interiors – our talk in July is on Philip Webb and the Bells.

After our walk a joint supper was shared in the marquee, we celebrated Tina's special birthday with some bubbles and birthday cake.

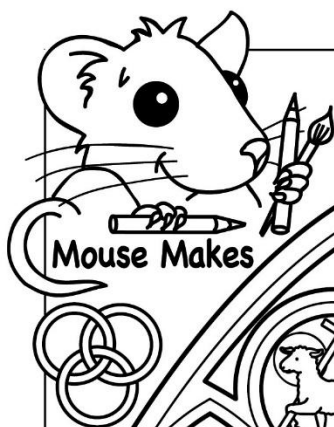
